Conference Objective:

The objective of the conference is to provide physicians and other health care providers with a broad range of practical information to help diagnose and treat child abuse and neglect.

Specifically, participants will have:

1. Increased knowledge regarding child abuse and neglect prevention strategies.
2. Enhanced knowledge of what constitutes Medical Child Abuse and when this diagnosis should be considered.
3. Improved understanding of the Child Protection Law and mandatory reporting of Child Abuse/Neglect; and the MI DHS Human Trafficking of Children Protocol.
4. A better understanding of what happens after a report (3200) is filed with CPS.
5. The ability to better recognize possible physical and sexual abuse.
6. Increased knowledge regarding what constitutes neglect.

Learning Outcome:

Participants will leave this conference with enhanced knowledge regarding the various aspects of child abuse/neglect and improved ability to manage cases of suspected abuse/neglect.

Physicians and other health care providers in a variety of practice settings who examine and treat children.

Featured Keynote Speaker

Dr. Vincent J. Palusci



Vincent J. Palusci, M.D., M.S. is Professor of Pediatrics at New York University School of Medicine in New York City where he is a board certified general and child abuse pediatrician at the Bellevue Hospital Frances L. Loeb Child Protection and Development Center. He received his medical degree from the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey and completed his internship and residency in pediatrics at New York University / Bellevue Hospital Center. He entered private practice and later joined the faculty of the College of Human Medicine at Michigan State University where he was a TRECOS scholar and earned a M.S. in Epidemiology and was Director of Forensic Pediatrics at DeVos Children's Hospital.

He was Professor of Pediatrics at Wayne State University School of Medicine and Director of the Child Protection Center at Children's Hospital of Michigan in 2005-2007. In NY, he chairs the NYU Hospitals Child Protection Committee and teaches students, residents and fellow. Dr. Palusci is a member of the board of directors of the American Professional Society on the Abuse of Children and a Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics. He serves as Editor of the APSAC Advisor and as a member of the American Board of Pediatrics Child Abuse Subboard. He received the Christine Nelson Outstanding Professional Award for Service to Children in Kent County in 2001 and the Ray E. Helfer Award for child abuse prevention in 2004 from the American Academy of Pediatrics and the National Alliance for Children's Trust and Prevention Funds.

Dr. Palusci's research has focused on epidemiologic and health services issues for child abuse victims and training needs for professionals in this area. He has written over 50 articles, chapters and reports for pediatric and child welfare publications. He edited *Shaken Baby Syndrome: A Multidisciplinary Response* with Dr. Steven Lazoritz (2002), and *Child Abuse and Neglect—A Diagnostic Guide* (2010) with Dr. Howard Fischer. He chaired the taskforce in 2010 that produced the APSAC Practice Guideline: *Integrating Child Maltreatment Prevention into Professional Practice*. Dr. Palusci worked with the Michigan Public Health Institute on an analysis of three state programs to assess child maltreatment deaths [Schnitzer PG, Covington TM, Wirtz SJ, Verhoek-Oftedahl W, Palusci VJ. Public Health Surveillance of Fatal Child Maltreatment: Summary of Three State Programs. *American Journal of Public Health*. 2008; 98(2):296-303] and methods to better estimate fatality counts [Palusci VJ, Wirtz SJ, Covington TM, Using capture-recapture methods to better ascertain the incidence of fatal child maltreatment. *Child Abuse and Neglect* 2010;34(6):396-402]. Dr. Palusci has looked specifically at the outcomes after child death review using citizen review panels in Michigan [Palusci VJ, Yager S, Covington TM. Effects of a citizens review panel in preventing child maltreatment fatalities. *Child Abuse and Neglect* 2010;34(5):324-331]. He recently published an article looking at child maltreatment deaths in the National Child Death Review Case Reporting System [Palusci VJ, Covington TM. Child maltreatment deaths in the U.S. National Child Death Review Case Reporting System. *Child Abuse & Neglect* 2013. <http://dx.doi.org/10.1016/j.chiabu.2013.08.014>] and the effects of reporting laws on reporting rates with Frank Vandervort [Palusci VP, Vandervort FE.
